

Review of Progress & Positive Impact of Replications of

PM-awarded Good Governance Initiatives

December 5-6, 2016

The two-day meeting to review the progress of PM Awarded Good Governance Initiatives was represented by 19 officials from across 10 states. Annexure-1 provides the list of participants along with their contact details.

DAY 1 - December 5, 2016

- The meeting was presided over by Ms. Smita Kumar, Joint Secretary, Department of Administrative Reforms (DARPG), Government of India (GOI) and was anchored by Ms. Richa Gaharwar, Director (AR), DARPG, GOI
- The Joint Secretary, DARPG briefed the attendees from the states on the objectives of the two-day meeting and its importance.
- The Director (AR) took stock of the representation from the States and UTs and the initiatives that they would be sharing information on.
- Prof. M. Chandrasekhar and the Project-Team from Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI) explained the status of replication of initiatives chosen by respective states with a re-assurance that ASCI continues to stand in readiness to assist the States and UTs in successfully undertaking the replication endeavor. A PPT presentation was made by ASCI to facilitate State-wise Initiative-wise discussions and to take stock of location/site-wise progress and success indicators thereof.
- Arising therefrom, State -wise progress of initiatives and action points as discussed in the meeting are as below:
 - **Bihar**
 - Bihar had chosen Sarguja Fulwari, Skill Development Program, Eraviperoor Grama Panchayat and Canal Top Solar Power Plant initiatives for replication
 - Out of the 4 initiatives, location-data was received for 3 initiatives and impact/success indicators were received for none.
 - Bihar was represented by officials from Department of Panchayat Raj, Govt of Bihar. The state representatives explained the status of replication of Eraviperoor Grama Panchayat. It was mentioned that the Decentralized planning and activity hub for service delivery components were chosen for replication in Bihar. As filled in data formats were not submitted during the meeting, they were advised to share relevant data in the prescribed format by December 15, 2016
 - Rest of the initiatives were not represented by the State
 - **Chhattisgarh**
 - Chhattisgarh had chosen Sakala, Rationalization of Affidavits, Skill Development Program, Revival of Sasur Khaderi and Canal Top Solar Power Plant for replication

- Out of the 5 initiatives, as on the day of meeting, while location data was received from the state for all initiatives, replication status and impact indicators were received for none.
 - Chhattisgarh, represented by the Secretary, General Administration Department discussed that the replications are progressing well in the state and submitted the success indicators for Skill Development, Canal Top Solar Power Plant, Sakala and Revival of Sasur Khaderi initiatives.
 - However, updated data for Skill Development and Rationalization of Affidavits was agreed to be submitted to the Project Management Unit (PMU) of ASCI by December 15, 2016.
 - **Haryana**
 - The state has identified CROPSAP and Canal Top Solar Power Plant initiatives for replication
 - As on the day of the meeting, location-data was received for both the initiatives and the success indicators were not.
 - CROPSAP and Canal Top were represented by officials from Department of Agriculture and Department of New and Renewable Energy respectively and the success indicators were submitted by the representatives.
 - Status of initiatives were discussed in detail and the delegates were apprised on the assistance rendered by ASCI
 - CROPSAP representative was advised to take assistance from NCIPM/NIC for expediting the development of software while.
 - For Canal Top, the team suggested that the state department could aggressively follow up on the funding proposal submitted to the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, GOI
 - The officials were advised to hasten the implementation with March 31,2017 as timeline for implementation
 - **Jharkhand**
 - Jharkhand had identified Save the Girl Child, Rationalization of Affidavits, Sarguja Fulwari, Skill Development Programme and Eraviperoor Grama Panchayat for replication
 - However, the representative from the state confirmed that the Eraviperoor Grama Panchayat would not be taken up for replication
 - The state had shared information on locations and success indicators in advance.
 - All the initiatives were discussed in detail and as Skill Development initiative has recorded substantial progress, it was decided that the status of the initiative be changed from “under progress” to “completed”
- Followed by the discussions on replication of various initiatives state wise, the officials were apprised about the website developed by the DARPG in association with ASCI. Major features of website; www.pmawardsreplication.in and its application were discussed with the participants. It was requested that the states make use of the

website extensively to gain detailed understanding of the original award winning initiative as well as the replication status in other states.

- The Joint Secretary advised that the updated data on success indicators received from states be uploaded on to the Progress Chart navigation of the website so that the states have a choice to refer to the progress of their peers.

DAY 2 - December 6, 2016

- State -wise progress of initiatives and action points as discussed in the meeting are as below
 - **Chandigarh**
 - The state had chosen Save the Girl Child, Hum Chhuyenge Aasman, Sakala, Sarguja Fulwari and Skill Development Programme for replication
 - Representatives for Save the Girl Child, Hum Chhuyenge Aasman and Sarguja Fulwari had participated in the meeting
 - While data on locations where the initiatives are being replicated was received by ASCI, success indicators were received only for Save the Girl Child and Hum Chhuyenge Aasman.
 - Success indicators for Sarguja Fulwari was submitted during the meeting
 - All the three initiatives along with the components adopted from the original initiative and changes made were discussed in detail and it was advised that the officials from other departments who are responsible for Sakala and Skill Development be updated on the meeting and relevant data be shared with the PMU by December 15, 2016
 - It was emphasized that the states share innovative changes that are being made to the original initiatives so that such stories could be captured in the upcoming publication(s)
 - **Gujarat**
 - Gujarat had identified CROPSAP, Skill Development Programme, Revival of Sasur Khaderi and Eraviperoor Grama Panchayat for replication
 - Data on locations was available for all the four initiatives and the data on impact indicators was received for one initiative
 - Progress of three initiatives; CROPSAP, Skill Development Programme and Revival of Sasur Khaderi were discussed during the meeting
 - Representative officials for CROPSAP and Skill Development Programme submitted the success indicators data during the meeting
 - As the Revival of Sasur Khaderi data was already received, updated information if any was requested to be shared by December 15, 2016
 - As the Skill Development Programme has been progressing well in the state, it was suggested that innovative components of the initiative be documented and shared with the PMU

- **Himachal Pradesh**
 - The state has identified Sakala, Rationalization of Affidavits, Saving the Womb and Eraviperoor Grama Panchayat for replication
 - As on the day of the meeting, location-data was received for all the initiatives and the success indicators were available for Sakala and Rationalization of Affidavits
 - Status of Sakala, Rationalization of Affidavits and Eraviperoor Grama Panchayat was discussed in detail during the meeting
 - In response to a query on continuous monitoring of Rationalization of Affidavits, the PMU had suggested that the state could refer to other states that have shown substantial improvement on the monitoring front. To facilitate the same, all relevant notifications and GOs were agreed to be made available on the PM Awards website.
 - Success Indicators for Eraviperoor Grama Panchayat were made available to the PMU during the meeting. As there is a good progress on the initiative; learnt from the meeting, the DARPG and the PMU agreed that the status of the initiative could be changed from “under progress” to “completed”
- **Odisha**
 - Odisha had identified Sakala, Rationalization of Affidavits, Skill Development Programme and Eraviperoor Grama Panchayat for replication
 - On the data front, the state had earlier shared information on locations for 3 initiatives and impact indicators for 1 initiative
 - During the meeting, the representatives had submitted the requisite data for all the initiatives
 - It was suggested that detailed information on the names of grama panchayats and impact indicators for a minimum of 5 such panchayats be shared with the PMU
- **Rajasthan**
 - The state had chosen Sakala, Skill Development Programme, Save the Girl Child and Achieving Total Financial Inclusion for replication in Rajasthan
 - While data on locations were made available to the PMU at ASCI for all the initiatives, success indicators were not received for any of the initiatives
 - The state representatives submitted the success indicators for Sakala and Save the Girl Child during the meeting
 - It was suggested to the representatives that the data for Skill Development Programme and Achieving Total Financial Inclusion be shared with the PMU
- **Tripura**
 - Tripura had chosen Skill Development Programme and Achieving Total Financial Inclusion for replication

- While the data for locations is available, success indicators were not received from the State
 - The official representing Tripura was asked to check with the initiative nodal officers from the states and was advised to share relevant data as soon as possible.
 - As Skill Development Programme and Total Financial Inclusion are continuous in nature, data as in December 2016 was asked to be shared for documentation.
- **To conclude States were requested to:**
 - **Share updated information by December 15, 2016;**
 - **Give due impetus to replication with a view to completing (beginning to end) at least one cycle / one logical portion / one instance by 31 March 2017;**
 - **Accord due priority to collecting and sharing the Success Indicators, since without measurable impact, replication would not be meaningful.**
 - **Share success stories (with impact data) with ASCI for hosting on website as well as with DARPG for being considered for publication on the occasion of the ensuing Civil Services Day.**
 - **Utilize the funds available with the States to the best extent possible under the extant Schemes (e.g. funds under RKVY for CROPSAP)**
 - **Mark the copies of communication written to line ministries to DARPG and ASCI for possible facilitation**
 - **Use the technical assistance of ASCI in capacity building etc.**
 - **Use the website www.powardsreplication.in for knowledge exchange and experience sharing (e.g. hosting of Acts and GOs, Rules, PPTs, Videos etc.) Accordingly, these may be shared with ASCI**
 - **Convey to colleagues (in case of initiatives which were not represented by any official in the meeting) about the discussions in the meeting and request them to contact ASCI and share progress / impact indicators with no further delay**
 - **In respect of those States / UTs which are not represented in the meeting, another similar meeting might be in order, since the experience from this meeting has been very positive and encouraging.**
- **The meeting with a vote of thanks to the Chair. ASCI expressed its gratitude to the Dept. for the progress and result-orientation by States / UTs that the meeting has spurred and facilitated.**
